

INDEXED JOURNAL

WHEN YOU WISH TO SUBMIT YOUR RESEARCH ARTICLE IN A JOURNAL. YOU HAVE TO SELECT THE TARGET JOURNAL FOR YOUR RESEARCH AREA AS WELL AS THE JOURNAL MUST BE INDEXED IN ANY OF THE MAJOR ABSTRACT INDEXING DATABASES SUCH AS WEB OF SCIENCE (SSCI, SCIE, ESCI, AHCI), SCOPUS AND ERA.

NON-INDEXED JOURNAL

THERE ARE A NUMBER OF JOURNALS (HAVING ISSN) WHICH ARE NEITHER INDEXED JOURNALS NOR SUB-INDEXED JOURNALS (NOT INDEXED BY ANY AGENT OF THE RESPECTIVE LIST OF AOIA PRESCRIBED BY UGC). HOWEVER, THEY MAY BE INDEXED BY SOME OTHER AGENTS NOT LISTED IN THE LIST OF AOIA OR MAY NOT BE INDEXED AT ALL. IN THE THEORY OF IRE SUCH A JOURNAL IS CALLED A NON-INDEXED JOURNAL.











Publishers indexed in Scopus





- DETERMINE THE AREA OF WRITING, REVIEW OF LITERATURE OR CASE STUDY.
- SELECT THE CONTENT AND COMPRESS INTO AN ARTICLE.
- REFER TO THE SUBMISSION GUIDELINES OF A JOURNAL.
- PREPARE YOUR FIRST DRAFT OF ARTICLE.
- CONSULT YOUR SUPERVISOR FOR FURTHER IMPROVEMENT.
- SEND YOUR ARTICLE TO THE CHIEF EDITOR THROUGH EMAIL OR OJS.
- WAIT FOR FEEDBACK, REVIEWER'S COMMENTS, DOING CORRECTIONS AND FINAL SUBMISSION.







BEWARE OF PREDATORY JOURNALS



What are predatory journals?

Well, a **predatory journal** is a publication, which actively asks researchers for the **manuscripts**. Moreover, they have no **peer review system** and also they have no true **editorial board** as well as are often found to publish mediocre or may worthless papers. Including this, they are also asking for the huge publication charges.

Moreover, the term predatory journal was found by **Jeffery Beall**, a librarian at the **University of Colorado**. He is the person who analyzed and observed a growing number of the exploitative **academic journals** charging author fees without the proper quality and the published papers.

Deceptive or **scamming journals** are also the other name of the **predatory journals** and are accused of applying the **poor academic standards**.

Online Vocabulary Games For Teaching And Learning Arabic

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Abstract

Arabic vocabulary learning is in dire need for additional teaching and learning aids, especially with the integration of advanced multimedia application such as digital or online games. This article reports on the findings of a study on the implementation of an online Arabic vocabulary learning games prototype among teenage learners in the Centre for Foundation Studies (CFS), International Islamic University Malaysia (IIUM). The evaluation on the usability, practicality and effectiveness of the game's prototype was conducted by various experts of Instructional Designers and Subject Matter Expert, and the different users among learners and lecturers. The formative evaluation is divided into three main phases: pre-formative evaluation, formative evaluation one and formative evaluation two. Findings from the evaluation process show that the online game enhances learner's perceived perception, concentration, immersion and knowledge improvement. Positive reports are also gathered from qualitative data from the implementation of open-


