# **VAPE SHOP RETAILERS' PERCEPTION AND BEHAVIOUR OF** ELECTRONIC NICOTINE DELIVERY SYSTEMS USE AT THE **KUANTAN DISTRICT: A PRELIMENARY REPORT**

Shop retailers become an essential source of information, advice, and influence for consumers on their vaping habits however the research on vape shop retailers is lagging despite the popularity of END. The survey aimed to assess the retailers' perception and behavior of END usage.

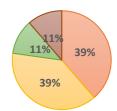

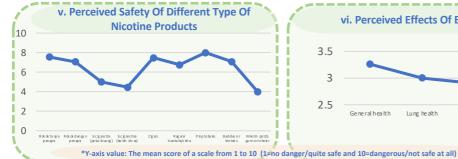

#### Discussion and Conclusion

- Our study findings concurred with previously reported studies; most retailers perceived END as safer than a regular cigarette<sup>1,2</sup>, the END could help in quitting regular cigarettes<sup>1,3</sup>, and they had • successfully ceased smoking after shifting to vaping<sup>3</sup>.
- The retailers serve as points of reference for potential vapers looking for information on END<sup>1,3</sup> and our study found that the most common information asked by vapers regarding the effects of END use to health.
- However, our study did not explicitly assess the level of knowledge of the retailers regarding END.
- The retailer's believed END is, on average, safer than other nicotine products<sup>1,2,3</sup> (e.g.; nicotine patch, gum, and inhaler).
- Likewise, they perceived it as having no to less harmful effects on general, lung, and oral health as compared to regular cigarettes<sup>1,2</sup>. The findings may reflect that they were unaware of the compelling scientific literatures that distinguishes between harms and benefits of END.
- Therefore, educating vape shop retailers on the benefits and harms of e-cigarettes is also an important part of the smoking education campaign.
