This allows readers to better understand the philosophical foundation of the Islamization of Knowledge movement. It introduces the important institutions and pioneers who had identified the necessity of the movement and also contributed towards its conceptualization. It helps readers in identifying and articulating the central theme and facilitates them to better analyze, evaluate and comprehend the full range of 'Islamization of Knowledge'. It also explains the need for the Islamization of religious sciences.

This book demonstrates that the movement is intellectually sound and practically relevant to all human beings—Muslims and non-Muslims. It explains that Islamization is not confined to any particular group of Muslim scholars, rather, it is in the agenda of all the different schools of thought present in the Muslim world. This is a necessary prerequisite for developing a comprehensive and well-balanced paradigm for the development of the human civilization which can be seen as an alternative to the present dominant Western paradigm of development.

Muhammad Mumtaz Ali was born in Hyderabad, India in 1955 and graduated in 1974 from Osmania University, Hyderabad. He received a Master's degree in Political Science from Aligarh Muslim University, Aligarh, India and later obtained his M.Phil and Ph.D in Islamic Studies from the same university while completing an empirical investigation of his research in England during 1982-83. Currently, he is an Associate Professor at the Department of Usuluddin and Comparative Religion, Kulliyyah of Islamic Revealed Knowledge and Human Sciences, and Chairman of the Seminar Committee at the department. He has presented several research papers in national and international conferences, and published in several journals in the area of Islamic thought.
