Bersatu's bank account has been frozen. Is this appropriate? Of course, supporters of Pakatan Harapan and Barisan Nasional will applaud, while supporters of Bersatu will say that government weapons are being used for private purposes and so on.

I don't care whether Bersatu is guilty or not. Just like the Prime Minister appointing Nurul Isah, I am not very interested in whether she is capable. I care more about credibility and principles. As a famous saying in the legal profession goes, justice must not only be done, but must be seen to be done.

Many times, when one political party is in power, the opposition party becomes the subject of investigations or is prosecuted. But after another change of government, those charged were released and the politicians or parties that were previously in power were investigated.

I am not defending Bersatu and saying they are innocent because the same thing happened when they were in power. My only question is why the MACC always investigates people who are no longer in power. On the other hand, the MACC and even the police rarely investigate those in power.

Of course, netizens will raise practical questions about this, and I agree with some of their views. As I mentioned in the article "[A Letter to the Government](https://www.themalaysianinsight.com/chinese/s/414846)" (<https://www.themalaysianinsight.com/chinese/s/414846>) written when Anwar first became Prime Minister, the government should focus on two things as top priorities, namely credibility and equal standards.

Now, six states are about to hold elections, and Bersatu needs funds to campaign. So is freezing the bank accounts of its opponents now a means of suppression?

Don't forget, no one is sure about politics these days. Pakatan Harapan once defended the requirement that MPs receive equal funding, but when it came to power in 2018, discriminatory allocations still occurred. When they lost power in 2020, they had nothing to say because they were the ones who reaped the consequences.

To this day, a few months after Anwar took office, I still believe that the most important task of the government is to establish the credibility of public institutions and restore public confidence in government institutions, such as the Anti-Corruption Commission, the police force, the Election Commission, etc. Sadly, no changes have been seen yet.

Although, I believe there will be no changes in the short term, I can only hope that this government can pay more attention to this aspect, sincerely reform government agencies, and revive and restore people's confidence in government agencies.

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
