Over the years, he has taught various university-required courses, including Basic Philosophy & Islamic Worldview, Knowledge & Civilization in Islam, and Ethics & Fiqh of Contemporary Issues. Additionally, he has taught courses on Creative Thinking & Problem Solving, Psychology, and Parenting & Family Management.

Abbas actively participates in international conferences and engages in research focusing on psychology, spirituality, globalization, and Iqbaliyat. His research efforts have resulted in numerous publications in both local and international journals, as well as contributions to newspapers and online news portals. As an author, he has published several works, including Iqbal's Theory of Personality: A Contrastive Analysis with Freud (2013), A Drop of Wisdom: Reflections on the Muslim World (2023), and Iqbal: The Renaissance Man from the Muslim World (2023).
