INTRODUCTION

DEFINITION OF TERMS

Urban Park

Urban Park can be defined as a place to rest our body and soul and also a place for doing various types of recreational and leisure activities. According to Olmsted (1997: 308), an urban park is a space of ground used for public or private recreation, differing from a garden in its spaciousness and the broad, simple, and natural character of its scenery and from a "wood" in the more scattered arrangement of its trees and greater expanse of its glades and consequently of its landscapes.

In America, the usage of the word 'urban park' as a general designation for gardens, green courts and all sorts of public places is an exaggeration of a French application of the word to the more private or kept grounds of a chateau connected with a forest (Olmsted, 1997: 313). By 1928, in the United States, the term "park" had come to mean "any areas of land or water set aside for outdoor recreational purposes, active or passive and part at least of this recreation is expected to come from appearance" (Jamil, 2002: 4).

Urban Park also can be defined as an educational place for all ages to understand the nature and wildlife. According to Cook (1972), the urban park is only a blessing and a

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
