INTRODUCTION




Figure 2.1: M42 Welcome breaks by Robert Bray (Photo: Izawati).

A number of Western countries have been developing Sustainable Urban Drainage (SUD) for many years. A very good example can be seen in the United Kingdom. It is clearly seen that they have been implementing SUDs very well. Based on the CIRIA guidelines on SUDs, 4 basic components have been introduced: ponds, wetlands, impermeable surfaces and filter strips and swales. These components have been used and integrated very well into the landscape design by the respective designers (Figure 2.1).

In Malaysia, the Manual Saliran Mesra Alam (MSMA) has also introduced the same components of the SUDS. However, there are limited examples be seen. The components are translated directly into the landscape (Figure 2.2 and 2.3). It would take more time for
