18. LIBRARY TRAININGS ON ELECTRONIC INFORMATION RESOURCES (EIR)

ABSTRACT

This chapter reports on the library trainings of electronic information resources (EIR). With regard to the training methods preferred by the library customer in learning how to use electronic information resources, the study revealed that more than half of the respondents (students and academic staff) preferred one-to-one training as their first choice of delivery method. As for the second choice of delivery method, the respondents' preferences differ significantly. Students preferred computer-assisted instruction/learning (CAI/CAL) as their next choice of training method, while academic staff preferred workshops. According to the librarians, the delivery methods practised by their libraries were Lecture with hands-on, Classroom lectures, Point of use and One to one. While according to the students, the delivery methods practised in their libraries comprised Lecture with hands-on, Classroom lectures, Point of use and also One to one.

A study was conducted in 2002 to observe information literacy programmes in Malaysian public universities (Sharif & Zainab, 2002).
