CHAPTER 3

REEVALUATING THE METHODS OF POLEMIC AND APOLOGETIC IN THE MUSLIM STUDY OF OTHER RELIGIONS HASLINA IBRAHIM

INTRODUCTION

The study of other religions is a science developed by Muslims scholars for answering the Qur'anic call for cross-cultural and religious communication. In this respect, the study of other religions can be perceived as an attempt to understand and actualize the vertical as well as the horizontal dimension of Tawäád ($\ddot{a}abl\ min\ al-n\bar{a}s\ wa\ \ddot{a}abl\ min\ All\bar{a}h$).

The contributions of Muslim scholars in developing the study of other religions have always been acknowledged by the scholars of those religions themselves.³ Nonetheless Kamar Oniah regretted that this science had once receded from the attention of the *ummah*, but is
