





K.S. Nathan is Professor and Head of the American Studies Centre at the Institute of Occidental Studies (IKON) in Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia. He holds a B.A. (Hons) in History, from the University of Malaya, Ph.D. in International Relations from Claremont Graduate University in California, USA, LL.B. (Hons) from the University of London, Certificate in Legal Practice (CLP) from the Legal Profession Qualifying Board, Malaysia, and LL.M. from the University of London. He is also a college-trained teacher (Malaysian Teacher College-Regional Training Centre, Kuala Lumpur), having obtained a Certificate in Education (Cert. Ed.). Prior to joining IKON, he taught International Relations at the University of Malaya and served as a Senior Fellow at the Institute of Southeast Asian Studies (ISEAS) in Singapore. He also edited the ISEAS journal, Contemporary Southeast Asia. He has published eight books and numerous articles in local, regional, and international journals. His teachings, research and publications are largely in the area of international relations and strategic studies including civil-military relations in Malaysia.
