

8.0 Conclusion

This study suggests that majority of IIUM graduates have confidence in IIUM in such that they would recommend IIUM to their families and friends who intend to further their studies. Similarly, a big majority of them have confidence in IIUM such that IIUM is their choice to further their studies. Nonetheless, when asked for suggestions for improvement of the programmes offered at the IIUM, a number of suggestions were related to overall improvement of the programmes, making the programmes more relevant to industry's needs and enhancing employability of graduates. At the point of the research, most of the graduates were of the opinion that the teaching and learning system at IIUM is exam-oriented. Currently, few initiatives have been taken at *Kulliyah* level in order to enhance existing teaching and learning system which is being described as too exam oriented by the IIUM graduates. This includes among others, subscribing to the outcome-based education. As such, continuous assessment is the part and parcel of the course assessment of all courses offered at the *Kulliyah*, mid-term examination is no longer made compulsory assessment for all courses and multiple method of assessment is encouraged. This includes assessments through case analysis, project work and research works. However, as highlighted by the graduates who participated in this study, the university needs to look into how the programmes can further enhance experiential learning, engagement with the industry and inculcation of soft skills and competency. These will indeed enhance the employability of the IIUM graduates.
