


## CARRYING CAPACITY FRAMEWORK IN REDUCING THE WASTE PRODUCED IN TOURISM AREA

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Abstract: Too many tourist on site means there will be more waste generated in the tourism site, directly or indirectly. Adding to that, the lack of waste management strategies in tourism area will lead to undesirable environmental quality. This will gives bad perceptions towards the future tourist and later on will impact the tourism industry itself. Hence, the implementation of carrying capacity concept specifically in limiting the number of tourist arrival is an effort to preserve the tourism area as a sustainable tourist destination as well as maintaining its natural values.
