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
INTRODUCTION & BACKGROUND

HINDRANCES TO GLOBAL PROMINENCE (INTERNATIONALIZATION): EDUCATION MOBILITY


- From a study (Altbach, Yudkevich and Rumbley, 2015).
 - Education mobility issues in higher education: immobility and inbreeding are the most problematic.
 - Inbred faculty tend to be: Local oriented, less exposure internationally,
 - Soler (2001) claims: countries with higher level of inbreeding produce smaller share of the world's research output & is often correlated with LITTLE academic/education mobility.
 - Why still inbreeding?
 - The researchers believe the importance of historical and cultural tradition; believes their graduates are better trained.

- One of the KII (KRA) is Shift 8- Global Prominence-Internalization-Mobility


