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CHAPTER 2

THE EXPRESSION OF MEANING AS A LOGICAL APPROACH IN THE CASE OF SEMANTIC STUDY

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Introduction

According to Jurjani, the relationship between syntax and semantics has not been effectively clarified within the framework of traditional Arabic grammatical theory. In his commentary (see Jurjani, *Dalā'il al-I'jāz*, 1960, pp. 66-67), he differentiated between 'meaning' and 'form' in a sentence. This concept is presented not to linguists but theologians (*Mu'tazilah*) in impressing on them the need to study not only theology but also grammar and literary theory in order to improve their understanding of the inimitability of the Qur'an.

The Nazm Concept

In order to have a connection between syntax and semantics, he introduced the concept of *nazm*, which combines three aspects: 1) *lafz hāmil*; 2) *makna bihi qāim*; and 3) *rabat lahuma nāzim*. This contribution showed the intellectual capacity of Jurjani, particularly
