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Identifying cues to deception in islamic websites text-based content and design (Conference Paper)

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Abstract

The exponential growth of the Internet and the availability and accessibility of **islamic websites**, have brought a new risk to the **islamic websites** which is **deception**. Some studies argue that **islamic websites** are not accurate and contain deceptive information that mislead users about the true **islamic knowledge**. However, previous studies have failed to address how **islamic websites** can be deceiving and what are the elements (**cues**) that could help user identify **deception** in **islamic websites**. This paper reviews general literature which focuses on **cues of deception** in the **text and design** of the **websites**. The conceptual findings suggest there is a tremendous potential of **cues of deception** in the **text and design** that can be used to identify **deception** in **islamic websites**.
