

Abstract

The Malaysia Ministry of Health reported adolescents' low utilization of healthcare services, although they need this service as a consequence of their involvement in risky behavior. This cross-sectional study aimed to determine adolescents' perception on risk taking behavior and their utilization of health care services. A modified self-administered questionnaire was used to collect data from 250 secondary school students aged 13 and 14 years in one of the selected schools in Malacca, Malaysia. non-use of helmets were the most reported risky behaviors among adolescents in Malaysia.
