Timeline of key events of COVID-19 in Malaysia



25 JAN 2020: MOH confirmed the first case of COVID-19

31 JAN 2020:

WHO declares Coronavirus a global health emergency.

MOH confirms an increase in COVID-19 + ve cases 6 FEB 2020: the first case of local infection

18 MAR-10 JUN 2020

PM announced Movement Control Order **12 MAR 2020:** cumulative cases rose to 158. WHO declares COVID-19 a pandemic



COVID 19's impact on theory classes

- Deferment of on-campus classes for few months.
- The university conducted series of trainings to equip lecturers on the various teaching and learning strategies (zoom, google meet, MS teams)
- Ensure the students have sufficient internet access → affects mental well-being (stress, anxiety)
- Altered the methods of delivery, assignments and assessments

Challenges - online teaching and learning



Barriers

Solutions

- Time constraint
- Poor technical skills
- Inadequate infrastructure
- Lack of institutional strategies & support
- Negative attitudes (learners/lecturers/admin)

- Improve educator skills (flexibility & creativity)
- Incentive and rewards for the time spent on the development & delivery of online content
- Improve institutional support
- Positive attitudes

COVID 19's impact on clinical placement





- Deferment of clinical placement at health clinics and hospitals effective on **17th March 2020**
- Resume clinical posting ONLY for FINAL YEAR students on 6th July 2020. Followed by Year 1, 2 and 3 on 5th August 2020.
- Allow at least a week for students self practice at simulation ward, CSC prior clinical placement.



Adjustment- clinical placement

Before COVID-19

- Sufficient quota
- Shift (AM, PM, Night shift)
- Various areas of placement.
- SOP on practice and the uniform

During/post COVID-19

- Number of student per ward per shift is reduced by half (12→6)
- Amend the shift/rotation of student placement (7 hrs→5 hrs)
- Student are not allowed to enter high-risk area (red zone ETD) interrupt the nursing board requirement
- Strictly adhere with the SOPs
- Infection prevention and control(IPC)



Re-education programme on the IPC

- To educate on the importance of standard precautions
- To educate on transmissionbased precautions (Contact, Droplet, Airborne)
- Prevent transmission of healthcare-associated infection (HCAI)
- Prevent incidence of sharps injury



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Methods of delivery

Briefing, demonstration, written assessment and OSCE)











Monitoring : Responsibility of Clinical Nursing Instructors



Only healthy students are allowed for clinical placement



Ensure students practice social/physical distancing at least 1-2 meter from others & comply with the PPE (Level 1, 2 or 3).



Keep updated and reinforce the student on any SOPs produced by the clinical facilities from time to time.



Work closely with the clinical facilities staff in ensuring any procedure done to the patient's student in a safe manner



Ensure the student practicing good personal hygiene after any contact with respiratory secretions.

- Flexibility and creativity to maintain high quality online teaching and learning

Practical session (CSC and hospitals)

- Physical distancing
