COMMUNICATION WITH PILGRIMS OF DIVERSE CULTURES IN ISLAM'S TWO HOLIEST CITIES

Every year more than two million Muslims from all parts of the world come to Makkah during the month of *Dhū al-Ḥijjah* to perform the annual pilgrimage. They come to Makkah to perform the pilgrimage in response to Allah's commandment in the Qur'an:

"And proclaim the pilgrimage among mankind: they will come to thee on foot and (mounted) on every kind of camel...."

Al-Ḥajj (22):27

Pilgrimage to Makkah *al-Mukarramah* is mandatory to every Muslim, male and female. It is the fifth of the five pillars of Islam. Every adult, sane and able-bodied Muslim who can afford it has to perform it once in a lifetime. Allāh s.w.t. says in the Qur'ān:
