Conclusion

This study revealed that Netflix and other over-the-top (OTT) broadcasting services in both Malaysia and Singapore are regulated by the old laws that govern the traditional broadcasting services. Some of these laws were not even amended after the launching of Netflix in January 2016 to make them compatible with it. As Netflix is broadcasted from abroad, these laws are not sufficient to control and regulate the content of it.
