

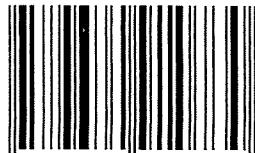

Management of Islamic-based development is a new mechanism in quality management including halal food quality. Considering the issue of integrity in halal food-quality management, efforts to empower the economy of the country through halal food are faced with obstacles and constraints. This book highlights issues commonly found in the management field. This is seen important as those in the management of halal food quality are sometimes trapped in issues that can tarnish Islam. The production of foods that are not pure in nature (halal status not genuine) can also have a negative effect on the morals and souls of Muslims. Recognising the fact that the development of the food industry has been dominated by non-Muslims, how can halal food-quality management be implemented in keeping with the true Islamic essence? This work is a small contribution, derived from findings of a theoretical-based research, to the implementation of Halal Standard MS1500:2009. To meet the needs of the food quality system and the requirements of Muslims, a new approach is introduced in this book through the Islamic *tasawur* as the mould of Islamic-based development management which presents a more holistic and comprehensive solution.

The author was born in Pendang, Kedah. She received elementary education from SK Kampung Chegar, and secondary education from SMK Syed Ibrahim and SMK Pendang. She later pursued her studies in Matriculation College, Pulau Pinang prior to her bachelor's degree in Universiti Sains Malaysia. Foreword

Alhamdulillah, praised be to Allah. With the consent and *inayah*, the collaboration between the Centre for Islamic Development Management Studies (ISDEV), USM and Dewan Bahasa dan Pustaka (DBP) (Institute of Language and Literature) which began in 2013 has now entered the second phase. In this phase, more work from ISDEV members have been successfully published. *Alhamdulillah*. The book in your hand now is one of the works from this second phase of ISDEV-DBP partnership.

In this second phase, there are three focal themes. The first revolves around the management of Islamic development institutions. The second relates to human development management, and the third theme focuses on *waqf* development. A total of five titles were published in the first theme, while three titles were published under human development management and *waqf* development, respectively.

Apart from these three themes, ISDEV has introduced four additional titles in this second phase which are related to Islamic development management. These titles include politics, halal quality management, tourism and Islamic-based research methodology. All these issues are of interest to ISDEV, particularly tourism and Islamic-based research methodology. Islamic tourism is one of the focus areas in the field of Islamic-based services management which has been introduced in ISDEV. Meanwhile, Islamic-based research methodology is a field that ISDEV is seriously developing.

The ISDEV-DBP second phase publication is unique in the sense that, one, the total number of titles surpassed the number published in 2014. In 2014, we published 12 titles as compared to 15 titles in 2015. It is a small increase, however there are another 10 titles in this second phase which are still in the process of writing, evaluating and manuscript refining. These titles are being brought forward to the third phase (2016), together with other new titles, *insya-Allah*.
