recover from the social and economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic against the backdrop of MCMC’s efforts in delivering JENDELA targets and the wider national efforts at realising the Malaysia Digital Economy Blueprint.

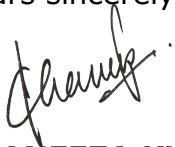
