Positive Impact (Students)

This helps in creating a conducive space for students to interact and have a sense of belonging in the absence of going to the campus

In particular, WhatsApp serves as a platform to update the students and to share challenges with their peers as well as lecturers.

In order to help peer-topeer learning, students utilize user-generated content tools such as Wikis, discussion boards, blogs, WhatsApp and social network platforms. Other social network sites that are used to create and build connection with students in different campuses include Facebook and Twitter

Redesign of course assessment

Centralized end-of-semester examinations in some universities have been changed to take-home exams

Some courses are now using i-Lectures as another channel of providing students with pre-recorded lectures. All this innovation is providing students opportunities to explore the new learning space.

The course content structure to suit online learning are also part of the new norm.

Internship



students who are doing **Internship** are asked to move their practice to online. It is now called virtual internship in some places, where the employers are now asked to provide the students with work schedules that are to be done from home.

In some cases, the internship-employing organizations are asked to provide students with check-in time, within which the students will contact the supervisor to ensure the tasks are ongoing or have been completed.



HEIs need to equip and upgrade their technology infrastructure for learning From the lecturers' dimension, there is a need to devise means to evaluate the engagement of students in an online class.

Universities need to step up by providing e-learning training to lecturers Sufficient technical support, good Internet services and availability of user-friendly teaching pieces of software are the key ingredient to support an effective online teaching environment
