The idea behind this is to provide an avenue for individual academics and scholars to meet and discuss research projects and opportunities for collaboration. The session will include brief presentations from three universities on research projects currently underway and the research grants system in their respective jurisdictions. These presentations are intended to kick-start discussion amongst participants, which will hopefully lead to some concrete outcomes. The Research Forum is open to anyone who wishes to attend.
