Abstract

MCMC research funding is provided under the Digital Society Research Grant (DSRG) programme, which builds upon our research collaboration work with universities which we have been engaged in since 2008. Funded research under the DSRG is aimed at providing quick project turn-around times, with actionable suggestions for the benefit of identified internal users' and their corresponding work requirements.

Two Call for Proposals (CFPs) are held annually with up to ten research grants being awarded per session. Awards are capped at RM10,000 per project with defined research durations of between 3 to 6 months for research activities plus additional time allocated to formal administrative and project closure processing and documentation.

The COVID-19 pandemic has brought by an era where technology becomes a necessity to carry on our daily lives especially in the studying and working contexts. As such, the efforts to ensure that all Malaysians are able to adapt to a more digitalised way of living becomes more significant than ever. For that purpose, MCMC introduces the theme **TOWARDS AN INCLUSIVE MALAYSIA: RESEARCH INSIGHTS ON THE IMPLICATIONS OF DIGITAL COMMUNICATIONS ON SOCIETY** to draw learnings from MCMC funded researches on the existing digital policies and initiatives.

This is to align with the Twelfth Malaysia Plan's (12MP) objective to create a prosperous, inclusive, and sustainable Malaysia by accelerating digital transformation and enhancing connectivity. In today's symposium, the Researchers will share their research findings which will highlight on the lessons learnt from the existing digital initiatives and policies whilst sharing their recommendations on how Malaysia can move forward towards building an inclusive society.

The DSRG builds the research evidence base necessary to promote and improve our understanding of the human and social factors, which affects and contributes to the adoption and usage of digital technologies and services. In so doing, DSRG funded research works provide inputs in ensuring that the advancements in communications infrastructure and services contribute to the inclusion and participation of all segments of the population in the realisation of a Digitally Connected and Informed Society (Digital Society).

For 2021, MCMC sought a combination of both OPEN and GUIDED research projects to clarify regulatory and developmental gaps and inform actionable outcomes in the following two categories:

- **Digital Citizenship and Cyberwellness** aimed at clarifying gap areas influencing participation, positive uptake and wellness in an increasingly digitally dependent world, and
- Digital Inclusion aimed at gap areas related to factors that impede equality of access and challenge the paradigm of ensuring that no one is left behind or is deprived of digital connectivity and its benefits.
